Anne Ito and Janet Shore, along with several committees of devoted members, spent two years of exhaustive work in preparing for this Bay Area conference for quilters. "Growth Through Diversity" was held on July 25-29, 1984, and drew quilt enthusiasts from many states and foreign countries. The lecturers and teachers list read like a "Who's Who" in quiltmaking. You can appreciate the phenomenal response to the Symposium just by reviewing its components:

Residual benefits from this first Symposium far exceeded anyone's expectations. For members of EBHQ, it was the best opportunity yet to socialize with the greater quilt community while growing in quiltmaking skills of every kind. Is there any question as to why the organization would want to repeat this endeavor in 1988?

With a current membership of nearly 700 individuals and 21 affiliates, EBHQ remains diverse in the quiltmaking experience of its members, as well as in age and background. There is no typical member; we are as varied as our quilts.

The organization upholds its 10-year standard of incomparable programs and peripheral activities.
