

Galactic Quilt-Tara Faughnan 2020

Log Cabin style quilts are some of my favorites to make and to look at, the variations on such a simple and humble block are endless. In this class you will learn how to draft a template, work with a large 60 degree angle diamond, and how to square up after each round of sewing to achieve a perfect block without a paper foundation.

Level: Intermediate

Supply List:

Basic sewing supplies:

- Sewing machine
- Rotary cutter
- Acrylic rulers - long rectangle shape for drafting and small for trimming seam allowance
- Small cutting mat
- Pins
- Sewing machine needles
- Scissors for both fabric and paper/plastic
- Thread
- 1 sheet heavy duty clear template plastic (12" x 18")
- Tape
- Permanent Marker
- Freezer Paper (at least 3 feet by 18" wide piece)
- Mechanical Pencil and eraser
 - OPTIONAL: Small portable design wall (40" by 40") I use an old piece of batting or flannel for this.
 - OPTIONAL: Mini iron and ironing board

Fabrics:

-Variety of $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ yard cuts of fabric. Do not choose scraps or fat quarters. Bring enough color choices to suit your creative style. Pick fabrics you love with a variety of light, medium and dark options. You can starch fabrics at home if you wish. Starch will help maintain the shape of the block and reduce amount of squaring up after adding each round.
