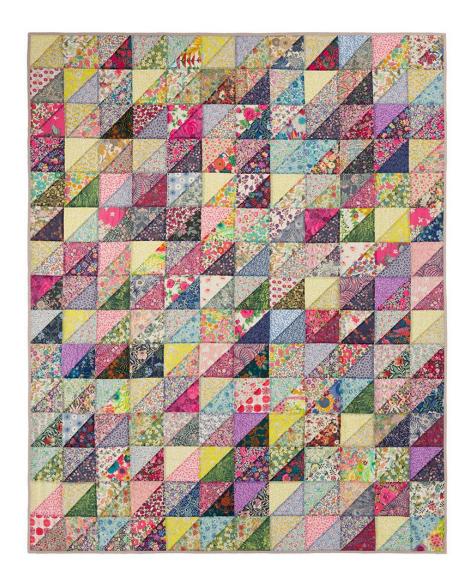


## East Bay Heritage Quilters Find The Value In Your Scraps Workshop, April 28, 2024 Blair Stocker



Class Description- Let Blair open your eyes to brand new ways to play with fabric and color in your quilt designs! In this workshop, we will experiment and let chance be our guide as Blair shows you the magic of color value and how to use it. We will design our own scrappy quilt using what that new color value knowledge.

\*Note- This workshop requires the purchase of one Ruby Ruler® per student.

**Skill level-** Easy for confident beginners, eye-opening for seasoned quilters. **Required Supply-** Blair's Ruby Ruler®- \$13.60 (Includes 15% guild discount)

Fabric needed for class- 180 5" squares of printed quilting cottons\*

Please choose only printed quilting cottons. The key to the success of this project is having a large variety of fabrics. The more variety you have, the more successful your quilt will be, and the more you will learn about value. This is a great chance to pull from your fabric stash and scrap bin- use prints you don't have much of, or ones that you don't love but would like to use.

\*For reference, 180 5" squares will equal about 3 ½ yards of fabric. Some ways to get good variety in your scraps.

- Cut squares from your stash (no more than 2 per print)
- Use precut charm packs
- Swap and trade with friends.

## Other Supplies Needed-

Rotary Cutter with a fresh blade/Cutting Mat

Preferred acrylic cutting rulers- I like two for this project- a 6" x 12" ruler and a square ruler at least 6"

One Paper Bag, like a brown shopping bag (you should be able to grab fabrics from inside the bag without seeing what you are grabbing)

Sewing machine with a fresh needle and neutral cotton sewing thread for piecing

A design wall

Iron/ironing surface

Straight Pins

Fabric scissors

Fabric marking pen

Seam Ripper

Pre-Class Prep- Please cut your 5" squares prior to class
